'Bar food with a twist,' Amy's Dockside Bar & Grille owner talks revamping former sport's bar

This July the Chamber and Visitors Bureau were able to host three remote workers through a grant secured from the Pennsylvania Wilds. The program is titled "The Wilds are Working" and was funded by a three-year grant from the Appalachian Regional Commission. This is the final year of the program and we were able to secure a grant to host remote workers here in Williamsport along with St. Marys being selected as the other host. St. Marys is conducting their program in August.

There are many communities in the PA Wilds region that are well-suited to become long-term homes for workers with flexible jobs, and a program designed to give those individuals and their families a "test run" of life in that community could help to attract and retain them. It also affords us the ability to show them employment opportunities with companies hiring here in the county.

This program was well-supported by the team at the PA Wilds Center. We were the beneficiaries of two prior years of experience which made this work much easier than if we had done this in the first year.

Those interested in participating in the program went through an application process that also involved their providing us with a video. Applicants could select which community they wanted to be hosted and I was very pleased to see that over 60 chose Williamsport. This was the most ever received for a community.

It was great to have such interest but also meant more time in reviewing all of the applications. Like anything, there were some that were fairly easy to dismiss; however, we did end up with a number of good to great applications that made for a challenging time in selecting our five finalists.

We had a phenomenal group that helped with this program in selecting and then helping to host these workers. After a rather lengthy meeting, we finalized the five that we were going to invite to join us here in Williamsport. Emails were sent and within a week we were able to receive acceptances back from all five invited. As we were ready to let the pool that we were going to be declining know, word came from the PA Wilds Center that we could add a sixth worker as funding became available. We discussed it and agreed to extend an invitation to another worker. That worker quickly accepted and we began our preparations for hosting them.

All was going well until about two week prior to their arrival. We had the first worker back out because of a family health issue. Then, the week prior we had two other back out with one having had their entire department furloughed and the other with a major family emergency. So we went from five to six then down to three within a matter of seven days.

At that point, I started to wonder what this was going to be like with just three remote workers. There wasn't much time to think as July 1 was upon us and we were welcoming our three workers who were from Pittsburgh, New York City and London, England respectively. We hosted a welcome reception shortly after their arrival and got a chance to better know each of them. It was easy to see that we had made good choices and that these workers were truly interested in experiencing the quality of life afforded those of us here in the area.

We had many opportunities to connect with them to hear about their experiences during their four weeks here. It was great to listen to them talk about discovering the various places to hike, swim and just get outdoors. I was impressed with everything they did given how hot it was during their time in the area.

One of the side benefits that came towards the end of their stay was through a chance meeting with one of our local hosts who met a young couple that was traveling across Pennsylvania. They had flown into Pittsburgh on a Monday and were driving across the state and flying from Philadelphia the following Monday back to Denver where they live. Through this chance meeting, they learned about this program and asked if they could attend one of the last cohort events being held the evening they were in Williamsport. We welcomed them to join us and through the two hours of the event, we learned that they were remote workers with two young children and wanted to move from Denver for a better quality of life and they thought Pennsylvania was that possibility.

They spoke to us about what they were looking for in a community and we were able to provide them firsthand the opportunity to speak with three remote workers that had been here for much of the month to share their thoughts and experiences. We also were able to provide them the time to talk with others who had moved to the area that were able to talk about life here in raising a family. They thanked us for the opportunity to meet everyone and said it was very helpful to them.

The last day for our remote workers was on July 28. A couple of days prior we held a closing reception that provided them an opportunity to share with us their thoughts and experiences of the community. It was very beneficial to hear from them as we wrapped up the program. There will also be more formal follow-up as well which they'll be able to provide even further insight to us. All said, this was a great experience for us and them. I'm hopeful that we might even see one of the remote workers move here with their family as they've already discussed with us employment opportunities in the area for their spouse who isn't a remote worker.

I'm looking forward to getting the full report on their views and believe it will be helpful to us as we work to grow our community. Hearing from them their thoughts on the area only reinforces my views on how great we have it here in living and working in Lycoming County. And, I should close in sharing that the couple that I referenced earlier that was from Denver, texted me before they flew back to Denver and let me know they had put an offer in on a home in Williamsport. Hopefully, if all goes well for them, we'll see a new family moving to our community - a great side-benefit from this program. So, thank you to the PA Wilds Center for providing us with this opportunity.

'Bar food with a twist,' Amy's Dockside Bar & Grille owner talks revamping former sport's bar

Amy's Dockside Bar & Grille, 2020 Riverside Drive, South Williamsport, is the latest pallet pleasure to pop up in the borough, but rather than serve up the same old dish, owner, Amy Harris, is looking to shake things up with a fresh menu.

"I worked at JP's Sportsbar & Grill for 10 years, then I went to manage the Whiskey Room for six years," Harris said, explaining that when she became aware of the former owner's intention to sell, she contacted him about making the purchase.

"He did have a few people inquire about it, and he said, 'if you're interested, we can work something out,'" she said.

"He really helped me with the financing part of the opportunity, and he said, 'I really want you to have this, you deserve this opportunity.' He wanted to see my dream come true," Harris said.

Despite Harris' long-time interest in opening her own restaurant, she said there were many times she reconsidered the venture.

"My husband, Mark, pushed me to do it because he said, 'it's been your dream, you need to move forward and try this.' So, he was my push," she said.

Though there are some holdouts from the establishment's previous incarnation, such as the previous owner's masterpiece rub which was very popular, and

cheesesteak and the wings specials being the same night, Harris said their goal has been to really change the whole dynamic.

"I worked there when it was kind of sporty and more geared towards 21 and over, and I'm trying to change it into a more family friendly atmosphere, where you're welcome to bring your children and have dinner," she said.

"There's games outside on the patio, and you can bring your dog and just be entertained in a chill,

relaxing atmosphere," Harris said, adding that smoking is not allowed on the patio until 10 p.m., while it is strictly prohibited within the restaurant itself.

"We added a bunch of seafood options, we have a kids menu, and there's a bunch of sandwich and salad options," Harris said. The restaurant has also added a brunch special on Sundays from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Other options Amy's Dockside Bar & Grille have offered include steak, garlic mashed potatoes and

asparagus, seafood broil and even a salmon dinner.

"We're trying to incorporate more options that aren't available everywhere. Bar food with a twist," she said.

Harris said the reception of the public has been overwhelmingly positive.

"I think people are loving it because they can bring their kids, we have high chairs for the babies and they can bring their dog and have dinner," she said.

"It's been overwhelming for

me, just the support from the community and the outreach of everyone wanting to see me succeed, it's just so nice. I'm almost in tears thinking about how great everyone has been. Actually, it's unreal to me," Harris said.

Along with all the revamping Harris has already put into the business, she has big plans for the future of the riverside eatery.

"We're redoing the second floor into a dining area. I think that'd be perfect to have up there because downstairs, there's not a whole lot of room and we still have the pool tables, so it still has a bit of a sporty vibe," Harris said.

The space will also be available for parties, private events and community events.

"We're also redoing the third floor, so we'll have rooftop seating and dining up there," Harris explained.

She hopes to have the rooftop dining area open by the fall.

"It's going to be a great spot just to relax and watch the river. The sunsets are incredible from up there and the view of the fireworks from the rooftop is awesome," Harris said.

The restaurant is open now, 4 p.m. to 2 a.m. Wednesday through Friday, from noon to 2 a.m. Saturday, and from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday, with plans to expand to seven days a week in the fall.





