From Jason Fink's Desk - President/CEO of the Chamber

While the calendar says it's the beginning of October, it feels more like early June. This last burst of warm weather appears to be driving people outside for one last shot of enjoying their favorite outdoor recreation activities. The parks and trails appear to be getting crowded. Now, this warm weather isn't great for all, as I know several hunters that would like to see the cooler weather for archery season.

For those that regularly listen to WILQ in the morning, you know that the Chamber has for many years joined Ted Minier on the last Thursday of the month to talk about business and community activities here in the county. I've been fortunate over the last almost 5 years to have the opportunity to join Ted and talk with him about what we have going on here at the Chamber as well as those items that involve the business community. You were probably as surprised as I was the other week when Ted told his listeners that he was going to be retiring this Friday, October 6. He's been in radio for 43 years and at Backyard Broadcasting for 32 years. Ted's been doing the Q's morning show since September of 2001.

If you've seen him at a live remote or caught him doing one of our Grand Slam Parade broadcasts, you never would have guessed he was 64 years old. However, as he told me when we were talking prior to our last program in September, he said "Getting up at 4am for 29 of the last 32 years has finally caught up with me. I still feel like I am 40 years old, and I want to carry that feeling into my retirement years."

Ted has been a great supporter of the Chamber and many other organizations in the community. He's helped us for many years in serving on the broadcast team for the Grand Slam Parade and has also done the voice work for our annual meeting video. While I'll miss seeing him at least monthly, I know he's not going far and will look forward to hearing from him about how much he's enjoying his retirement. He'll also still probably give me some grief as well about not being able to fly out of our local airport. I want to wish Ted a long and enjoyable retirement and thank him for all he's done for us and so many others here in the community.

Speaking of the airport, you may have caught that the commissioners were speaking at a recent meeting about some of the impacts that could affect our county should the government shutdown occur. It was rather discerning to hear that among the various items mentioned, that the airport was included as potentially being affected. Fortunately, there's been a 45 day extension of the budget to allow for all parties to come to some resolution. The maddening aspect to it is seeing that this may occur again if they don't and knowing that this could further add to the challenges we're seeing in getting air service returned to Williamsport. I know that the director of the airport has been in discussions with various airlines trying to get service back to Williamsport. Hopefully, we'll see something in 2024 on that front.

Another item that I wanted to note was the recent announcement that the United Automobile, Aerospace and Agricultural Implement Workers of America (UAW) Local 787 accepted Lycoming Engines' new five-year contract. Members of the UAW 787 union voted and approved the agreement on this past Thursday, which covers over 365 employees working at the local Williamsport plant. The contract expired back in July and the union had been working without a contract from that point to last week when the new one was ratified. It was great to see that Lycoming Engines has a strong partnership with its union and their membership. I'm glad to see that they have a good working relationship in comparison to what we're seeing with the automotive industry.

Before wrapping up, I'd be remiss to not remind you to catch the information we have about some of our upcoming community events in November and December. Our annual Pie Day 5k on Thanksgiving morning had over 560 participants last year. If you're looking for a way to justify eating that extra piece of pumpkin pie, this event should do the trick for you. We also have details about the annual Trolley Tour of Lights and Santa Express. These events will sell out, so if you missed out last year and said you were going to do it this year, now's the time to act. This time next month we'll almost certainly be sold out for both of these events. That's all the talk I'm going to do about November and December. I'm going to focus now on the next couple of days and try to enjoy this last taste of warm weather before fall really hits us.



Owners of hotel, country store appreciate 'perfect' location

Waterville is a sleepy rural village not exactly teeming with activity, a stopping point for anglers, hunters, hikers, and other outdoor enthusiasts, many of them heading deeper northward into the Pine Creek Valley.

But that doesn't keep Jason McConnell and Vanessa Brown from being plenty busy.

The couple own and operate the Waterville Hotel and McConnell's Country Store, which sit next to each other in the heart of the community along Route 44.

"We bought the store five years ago," Brown said. "Jason's dad owned it. I had been working there since I was fourteen."

McConnell's might be described as the very nerve center of Waterville, a busy enterprise where locals and others can pick up anything ranging from hunting and outdoors supplies to food, even gasoline at the pumps outside the store.

The delicatessen at the front of the store keeps the staff busy making sandwiches and filling orders.

Anglers have longed stopped off at McConnell's to stock up on supplies, particularly the fly-fishing materials located in the store's outdoors shop.

Pine Creek and Little Pine Creek, both noted fine trout streams, are literally a stone's throw away.

The Pine Creek Rail Trail running just behind the store draws cyclists as well as walkers.

Brown felt their initial business decision to purchase the store has worked out just fine.

"I'm really glad we did it," said Brown, a Lock Haven University graduate and like McConnell a long-time Waterville resident. "Jason's dad (Glenn) was ready to sell."

With outdoors activities as the draw, the seasons of spring, summer, and fall are the busiest times for the store.

The COVID pandemic, Brown noted, seemed to lure more people to the outdoors and to their business. "We got a lot of tourists that first year," McConnell added.

Both feel the location of the store about 12 miles from Jersey Shore makes it

a prime site.

"The location is perfect," McConnell said.

They don't do a lot advertising to get the word out about either the store or the hotel.

"We don't have to," Brown said.

Neither McConnell nor Brown were experienced entrepreneurs, but it helped that the two were familiar with the store and the hotel.

Having in place experi-

enced staff at both businesses has been a big plus, they said.

The hotel, which can trace its origins to 1825, includes a full inside bar and dining as well as lodging upstairs.

"The outdoor bar is a big thing when the weather is good," Brown said.

Diners can select from a menu that includes sandwiches, burgers, steaks, seafood, appetizers, soup and salad, as well as weekly specials.

"We bought it (hotel) in July," Brown said. "We are just now finding our balance."

The two have worked out a plan to operate both enterprises.

"I am over at the store more," Brown said. "He's here (at the hotel) more."

The biggest challenge in running two businesses, she said, is simply finding the time to do everything that needs to be done.

"It keeps us moving," she said.

On any given day, their duties include everything from serving customers, dealing with vendors, check-




